

Common Name: Noble Fir
Scientific Name: *Abies procera*

Sun Exposure: Full sun

Average Size: 100-200 feet tall and 3-5 feet in diameter

Moisture: Prefers moist sites; **not** drought tolerant

Elevation: mid to upper elevations, (1,400 to 6,000 feet)

Soils: Grows in a wide range of soil types; prefers deep, rich soils

Shape: Coniferous tree, tall and usually very symmetrical, conical in shape, trunk often clear of limbs for 1/2 to 2/3 its length

Foliage: Evergreen ~Needles are 3/4” to 1 and 1/4” long, massed on the upper side of the twigs; blue green in color

Flower: N/A

Fruit: N/A

Notes:

- Commonly grown as a Christmas tree
- Susceptible to fire damage
- Its lumber is often marketed as “Oregon Larch” but it is not a larch pine.
