

Common Name: Snowberry

Scientific Name: *Symphoricarpos albus*

Sun Exposure: Full sun to part shade

Average Size: 2-6 feet tall with approximately equal spread

Moisture: Can handle dry to moist sites. Very adaptable.

Elevation: Sea level to mid elevations

Soils: Adapts to a wide range of conditions, from forests to rocky slopes

Shape: Upright growth habit, rhizomatous (spread by underground runners)

Foliage: Deciduous, opposite, elliptical to oval, 2-5 cm long

Flower: Pink to white, bell-shaped, 5-7 mm long, in short, dense clusters of few flowers, mostly terminal.

Fruit: Clusters of white, berry-like drupes (6-15 mm across) with two seeds; persist through winter

Notes:

- Very good wildlife habitat as it can form dense thickets.
- **BERRIES ARE POISONOUS!**
