Common Name: Subalpine Spirea Scientific Name: Spiraea densiflora

Sun Exposure: Full sun to part shade, prefers full sun **Average Size**: 2-3 feet in height and about an equal spread

Moisture: Grows best in moist to wet sites

Elevation: Found naturally at mid to upper elevations (1,500 to 10,000 feet),

though it will grow and can bloom twice a year at lower elevations

Soils: Can grow in a wide range of soils. Prefers moist, acidic soils. Often found

along streams or in mountain meadows.

Shape: Small, multi-branched, woody shrub.

Foliage: Deciduous ~Leaves are bright green ovals, with teeth on the upper

halves, covering the many fine stems.

Flower: Pink, fragrant, dense, flat-topped flower clusters 3 inches across bloom

in summer.

Notes:

• Attracts butterflies

• Excellent riparian plant

• Sometimes hybridizes with Douglas spirea to create an intermediate form.
